NJ Turnpike to exit 14 or Garden State Parkway to exit 142B, I-78 West to exit 36, King George Road South becomes Mt. Bethel Road.

FROM PA, WEST:

I-78 East to exit 36, King George Road South becomes Mt. Bethel Road.

FROM NORTH:

NY State Thruway South to I-287 South, Exit 21A to merge onto I-78 East (toward NYC). I-78 to exit 36, King George Road South becomes Mt. Bethel Road.
